*Some New Things to Try!*

Dear Church-

There are three new things happening at St. Matthew's that I want to share with you today. The first is our new **Café** Group for women; the second is that curious "tower" in the Welcome Center; and third is a gathering for our new and old acolytes.

**CAFÉ GROUP:** The ELCA has a wonderful online magazine and podcast **Bold Café** which was created for "young adult women who identify as Lutheran or not." *Café* shares stories from bold young women who write about faith, relationships, advocacy and more. Readers and writers of *Café* include pastors, seminary and college students, and other young adult women. I am pleased to say that I know several of these writers and their contributions have been outstanding. These online resources can be used as a Bible study resource individually or with a group.

Although many women in their 20s and 30s contribute in every issue, it can be used and shared by women of any age. With that in mind, we are going to start a **Café Group** which will have its first meeting on **Thursday, October 11th at 7:00pm at the Starbucks in Quakertown**. The conversation will be directed by the October Monthly topic which has not yet been posted. (September was "God with us.") If you're interested in being a part of this new adventure. Check out the online resources at [boldcafe.org](http://boldcafe.org) and look for me and Holly Thorrington at the Starbucks. (We don't quite fit into the target demographic but we are committed to getting this new ministry on its feet.) If you have any questions, please talk to me or Holly.

**PRAYER TOWER:** If you've been in the Welcome Center in the last two weeks you hopefully saw our triangular shaped grid wall tower. We've been trying to come up with a good name but so far "**Prayer Tower**" is our best choice. (If you have a better idea, please let me know.) The original idea was that this would be a place for the kids to place prayers for sharing with the community, but on the very first day, it was clear that this was something our whole community could share.

The idea is simple. There are cardboard tags on which you can write your prayer and then fasten it to the tower. Other folks who see your card can then share in your prayer petition. For those who would like to take a prayer request with them, cards have been provided. If you have other ideas on how we might make this tool even more useful, please let me know. If you have kids in your family, encourage them to make use of the Prayer Tower whether they have prayers of concern, prayers of thanks or prayers of celebration.

**ACOLYTE MEETING:** On **Saturday, October 20th** we will have a meeting for our new and old acolytes at 10:00am. This hour long gathering will include **acolyte training** and conversation with me about ways that acolytes can serve as a second pair of eyes, hands and feet for the pastor and liturgists. EVERYONE in fifth grade and older is invited to participate in this meeting.

I hope you will support these new ventures with prayer and participation in the events that appeal to you. If you have any questions, please let me know.
